COURT OF PROTECTION

If a loved one loses the capacity to manage their own affairs the Court of Protection has jurisdiction to make decisions for them, including appointing someone to act on their behalf.

We can assist with this process.

Those appointed are known as deputies. The court can often appoint deputies to manage someone's financial affairs and, in some exceptional circumstances, to make decisions regarding the patients health and welfare.

Deputies must file reports each year. We can assist with both the initial application and with the ongoing deputyship reports.

In some circumstances there may not be anyone suitable or able to be appointed as a deputy. In these situations we can apply to be appointed as a professional deputy.

CARE FEES AND LOCAL AUTHORITY FUNDING

We understand that paying for care and interpreting the rules surrounding local authority and NHS funding is something which often causes concern. We can assist with looking at each individual situation in line with the requirements and help you complete any financial assessments or checklists. We work closely with care consultants and Independent Financial Advisors who can add valued advice.

STATUTORY WILLS

We strongly advise all our clients to draw up a Will that reflects their wishes. However if a client has lost capacity there may be circumstances where they should be able to have a will drawn up on their behalf. The Court of Protection can order that it is in the individuals best interest to have a will prepared for them. We can advise on the likelihood of the court making such an order and assist with an application where appropriate.
